The Kogarah Storehouse and its name

Any visitor to the suburb of Kogarah, located just 14 kms south of Sydney CBD, cannot help but notice the imposing presence of the St George Hospital, one of Sydney's larger teaching hospitals. Founded in 1894 it has steadily grown in size and in the process, by necessity, has resumed many properties around it. Two such properties resumed in 1986 were the Kogarah Methodist and Congregational churches who had become, only some few years earlier, the Uniting Church in Kogarah. Consequently, dispossessed of their buildings, the parishioners had to find a new place of worship. After a lot of prayer and trust in God, they felt led to a derelict, 100 year old factory on the corner of Gray and Kensington St. With its open spaces.

This "New" Uniting Church in Kogarah, was not going to be your typical traditional church, rather it had a vision to be a centre which was open and welcoming to the community. The congregation wanted to 'share God's love with its local community' This was to be a humble place which expressed the love of God in tangible, practical ways helping people in our community.

This simple vision, now with a new mission to reach out to the community, reminded us of the biblical passage Malachi 3:10: "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this, says the LORD Almighty, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it."

And so **The Kogarah Storehouse** found its name and God kept his word in that he continues to bless the people and work being done here.
